## METHODOLOGY:

The sample size for the survey is 507 likely voters and the margin of error is +/-4.35 %. The Interactive Voice Response (IVR) automated telephone survey was conducted April 7-9, 2014 by Harper Polling on behalf of American Crossroads. The total percentages for responses may not equal 100% due to rounding.
